

Our Geocaching Experience

On the Tuesday of last week, our Foundation English class went with Mr Stagg, to find a geocache. The one we found was quite close to the school. It was created by our former science teacher Mr Mitchell.

Geocaching is a grownups version of a scavenger hunt. Participants use a GPS or mobile device to hide and seek containers called geocaches anywhere in the world. A cache is a weather proof box that contains a log book, treasures and the instructions. There is an option to take something, as long as you replace it with something else. This is like a trade.

Geocaching began on the 8th of May, 2000.

There are currently three geocaches in Murrayville that we are aware of.

Once we had found the cache, we located the logbook and wrote in our usernames and when and how we found it. Inside the cache we found a lot of plastic animals, a broken toy aeroplane and a wristband.

Mr Stagg had gone out a couple of days before and found it, so he was the last person to have signed in the log-book.

We all enjoyed the geocaching experience and would like to thank Mr Stagg for sharing this with us.
