Arts Council -

Melbourne Theatre Company visited on Tuesday and presented a confronting piece called Yellow Moon to the secondary students. This play addressed a number of issues that face young people in our society, and was enjoyed immensely by the students.

Try a Trade -

Today our Year 11s and 12s travelled to Mildura to the Try a Trade expo at the Sunraysia Murray Group Training Trade Centre. This is an excellent opportunity for the students to have some hands on experience in a wide range of apprenticeships. The students moved through a number of stations, such as electrical, bricklaying, carpentry, plastering, clerical, hair & beauty, hospitality. The students then visited GTS trucks to investigate logistics careers and Princess Court Aged Care Facility to investigate nursing, allied health, hospitality and managerial careers.

Practice GAT -

The General Achievement Test is an essential part of the VCE assessment procedures. Although GAT results do not count directly towards a student's VCE results, they play an important role in checking that school-based assessments and examinations have been accurately assessed. All students completing a Year 12 subject sat a Practice GAT on Wednesday. This was a very worthwhile exercise and all students now feel comfortable with what will be expected for the real GAT.

Attendance -

All students should be aiming for an average attendance of above 90% at school. We know that if students miss more than 10% of their learning time their success can be severely impeded. Last Friday marked the halfway mark of this term, congratulations to the seven P-6 students who have attendance above 98% for the year, and the eleven 7-12 students who also have 98%+ attendance. Unfortunately we also have five P-6 students and thirteen 7-12 students with an average attendance below 90% for the year.

Reports -

All teachers are currently working hard to complete their reports. There has been a slight change to the formatting of the VCE and 7-10 reports. It is hoped that these changes will improve the clarity for parents and students.

Former Students -

We have made contact with some of our previous students asking them if they are prepared to give us an update on their activities since leaving MCC. This was a popular section in newsletters in the past and we hope you enjoy 'catching up' with the current contributors.



I transferred to a Bachelor of Nursing and after 3 years of study I was successful in



gaining a Graduate Nursing Position as a Registered Nurse at the Women's and Children's Hospital. After rotating through different wards I found myself in the fast paced Paediatric Emergency Department (PED). Now after 6 years in the PED I am currently a Nurse Education Facilitator, educating new staff and keeping current staff up to date with best practice, as well as Clinical Nurse working with seriously ill or injured children. Nursing as a profession has allowed me to travel Australia and the world, for both pleasure and work. I have been to Europe, Fiji, Vanuatu, United Kingdom, Ireland, and in 2013 my job gave me the opportunity to volunteer in India with a team of Doctors and Nurses from our department. Going to school at MCC gave me opportunities to be involved in leadership positions through sport & SRC president. This has given me a good footing to take on many of the challenges I face as a Registered Nurse on a daily basis. Not knowing what to do with myself at 18 has worked out and I'm in my dream job 10 years later.

eHealth



The Personally Controlled eHealth Record System

Helping Australians better manage their health

eHealth is a valuable tool primarily for general practitioners, pharmacists, hospitals, allied health professionals and specialists, to see and share their patients health information (with their permission), such as medications, allergies, test results or scans with each other. This means more effective and safer care for their patients.

It provides a secure online summary of your health information. You control what goes into your eHealth record and who is allowed to access it. Individuals will be able to see a secure online summary of their personal health information when and where they need it. They can choose which of their health care providers they can share this with including their general practitioner, pharmacy, hospital, allied health professional or other health professional. Your eHealth record means that your own medical records will be available to any registered provider, anywhere in Australia, at any time.

This means that even if you are on holiday in a different part of Australia, local medical professionals can access your complete medical records, including any allergic reactions. Registering is free and easy, and can be done at Mallee Medical Practice, Pinnaroo, on Wednesday 18th June between 9am and 5pm.
