Teams worked in groups of three to calculate the concentration of six different solutions. The results came through on Monday and "The team of Wurfel, Fearnside and Beer finished joint second in Year 12, and joint second overall in the State. After completing Year 12 at Murrayville Community College in 2006 I moved to Adelaide to study Bachelor of Social Science (Human Services) at UniSA. I graduated from University in 2010 and began my career working as a Disability



Support Worker for YourKids Children and Youth Service. My role involved providing independent living and behavioural support to children with Autism who were unable to continue living at home. After working in disability for two years I started my new job with the Salvation Army as a residential Youth Worker in a homeless shelter. The service provides support for eight young people aged between 15-17 years. After six months I was lucky enough to be offered the Case Manager position. I really love my job and being able to help young people set and achieve their personal goals while working towards independence. I enjoy the variety my job brings as no day is ever the same! Young people who we provide support can be experiencing various issues including mental health, domestic violence, drug and alcohol concerns, legal issues, financial difficulties and family relationship breakdown. Advocating for young people to access support services and future housing opportunities can be challenging - yet very rewarding!! I'm now looking forward to my three week holiday to New Zealand in August, I haven't done much travel yet but have decided to explore more before saving to buy my first home!




You are invited to join us at Murrayville Community College between 1:45 and 3:15pm on Friday 22nd August to celebrate Science Week.
