

There was a buzz of excitement in the air as the Murray Bridge 24 hour pedal prix race had finally arrived. The riders had trained hard and prepared themselves for the challenge ahead. Many had improved upon their fitness and times over the last month, but most importantly many had improved upon their ability to stay in the car and last the distance, which is extremely important for the long 24 hour race.

With only 6 riders in HOT M, the primary team was determined to race well and finish in the top 10. Change of Preference – Closes – 5th January, 2015 Round 1 Offers – 15th January, 2015 Over the weekend 11/12 October, year 11 biology students, Kayley Beer and Ella Gibson, together with teacher, Karen Bailey, went to the Wyperfeld National Park to participate in the Victorian Malleefowl Recovery Group (VMRG) training weekend.

VMRG are a volunteer group who spend some of their spare time in summer checking every plotted malleefowl nest, both used and unused, in the Victorian region. There are over 800 known mounds that have been recorded on a yearly basis since early 2000 for activity, animal prints and scats (particularly foxes) and photographed. The data obtained is used for a range of conservation research projects.

We joined in to learn more about the Mallee environment and these unique malleefowl birds.

We were fortunate enough to be accompanied on our walks with an ex-biology teacher and an expert in Mallee plants. They identified many of the native plants and showed us an active mound. The students are using the information gained from the excursion to write a field trip report as part of the Unit 2 Biology course.


