

ICAS English Competition

Students achieved excellent results when they participated in ICAS English this year. Entries for this competition are accepted from schools in Australia and New Zealand. Those students whose achievements were outstanding were rewarded with Certificates of Merit, Credit, Distinction and High Distinction.

The test paper assesses reading and language skills in a range of contexts. The questions require students to locate, identify, interpret, infer and synthesise information in and about texts. Students read a variety of texts which narrate, describe, explain, argue, persuade and review. These texts cover a range of topics and may include tables, diagrams, maps and other visual information. The texts which



students read increase in complexity, moving from simple texts dealing with familiar subjects and topics to complex texts incorporating abstract concepts and sophisticated language structures.

Thirty-three students, from Years 3-12, participated in the competition at Murrayville this year.

We commend the students on their effort and achievement, as well as their willingness to challenge their abilities.


