You can even search by genre, book type and age. Books are added to the list regularly by an expert panel which includes teachers and librarians.

Children who meet the Challenge receive a certificate from the Premier and get their names published on the online Honour Roll!

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2015 for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be held on Tuesday 12 May, Wednesday 13 May and Thursday 14 May 2015. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals which can be used to improve student achievement.



All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. During test week, catch-up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days. These students may undertake catch-up tests on the days in the test week after the scheduled test, up to and including Friday 15 May 2015.

Later in the year you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. The report will describe your child's particular skills in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

UNSW Mathematics, English and Writing Competitions

This week students in Years 3-12 received a letter regarding the UNSW Mathematics and English competitions. All students are encouraged to enter; however, to do so they need to complete the slip, at the bottom of the letter, and return it to their classroom teacher, form teacher or front desk by Friday the 1st May. The competitions are marked externally and students receive a certificate which outlines their strengths and weaknesses, as well as how they performed in relation to the cohort of their particular year level. Participation, Credit, Distinction and High Distinction certificates are awarded. Information regarding each paper can be found below.

Mathematics

There are 30 to 40 items in each paper, with a time allowance of 40 minutes to one hour, depending on the year level. Questions require students to apply their knowledge, skills and understanding across the skill areas of number and arithmetic; algebra and patterns; measurement; space and geometry and chance and data.

Sitting date: Tuesday, 11 August

English

There are 33 to 60 items in each paper, with a time allowance of 40 minutes to one hour, depending on the year level. Questions require students to apply their knowledge, skills and understanding to locate, identify, interpret, infer and synthesise information in and about texts. Students read a range of texts that cover different forms and purposes.

Sitting date: Tuesday, 28 July

Writing

Teachers select students to participate in the Writing Competition; it is seen as an extension activity for talented writers.

Students will be asked to write an extended response to a given task in a 30 minute time slot. The task is criterion referenced and assessed by trained markers. The genre alternates between narrative and persuasion. In 2015, persuasive writing will be assessed.

Sitting date: The week of Monday, 15 June – Friday, 19 June, exact date will be stated closer to the time.

House Cross Country next Friday (1/5/15)

This year we have moved our cross country track across to the Recreation Reserve. All students from Prep – Year 12 will start and finish the race in the same place, but the tracks differ depending on age groups.

16 – 20 Boys will run 5km (3 laps). Their track consists of 1 big loop followed by 2 little loops. The big loop is marked in pink and they then follow the green track when they reach the SE corner of the oval. They then do two more little loops, marked in pink.

- 11 15 Boys and 11 20 Girls all run 3km (2 laps). Their track consists of 2 loops following the pink track on the map.
- 9 10 Boys and Girls run 2km. Their track consists of 1 loop marked in pink, plus an extra lap around the outside of the oval marked in purple.
- 7 8 Boys and Girls will run 2 laps on the outside of the oval.
- **5 6 Boys and Girls** will run one lap around the outside of the oval.

Age groups go by how old each student turns in 2015. For example, if a student turns 10 or has already turned 10 in 2015, they are in the 10 year old age group. Races will begin at 9:30am Vic time and the order will be as follows:


- 16 20 Boys (5km)
- 11 20 Girls (3km)
- 11 15 Boys (3km)
- 9 10 Boys and Girls (2km)
- 7 8 Boys and Girls (1km)
- 5 6 Boys and Girls (500m)

Please make sure you arrive well before 9:30am as we will not allow cars to drive in or out of the oval area once the races have begun, until all students have finished racing. Please also do not park around the oval fence line as that is where the students will be running. If your car is parked around the oval where you will be near the race track, we ask you not to leave until all races are over

The students run along the boundary line inside the oval on the western side so the best place to watch from is in front of the Rec Hut and change rooms. There are bench seats available right next to the oval. The finish line is where the first football bench is located.

Presentations will be made immediately after the races have finished.

We hope you enjoy the MCC Cross Country carnival.
