From the Principal

Welcome back -

I trust that everyone had an enjoyable break from the routines of the school week over the holidays, and that students have returned invigorated and ready for learning. Term three is a very important term for all students, especially those in Year 12 as most of their courses will be complete by the next holiday break. This term, we welcome two new students into our college, Emmazyn in Prep and Jarrod in Year 5, we wish them every success in their educational journey with us. We also welcome back Lyn Sporn after six months' leave.



Motivational Speaker -

Today the secondary students attended a motivational session with speaker Abdi Aden. He told them his fascinating story of survival and triumph. Abdi's world fell apart when he was only fifteen and Somalia's vicious civil war hit Mogadishu. Unable to find his family and effectively an orphan, he fled with some sixty others, and joined another 300 heading to Kenya. On the way, death squads hunted them and they daily faced violence, danger and starvation. After almost three months,

they arrived at refugee camps in Kenya of the group he'd set out with, only five had survived. He was just sixteen years old when he arrived in Melbourne. He had no English, no family or friends, no money, no home. Yet, against the odds, he not only survived, he thrived. Abdi went on to complete secondary education and later university. He became a youth worker, was acknowledged with the 2007 Victorian Refugee Recognition Award and was featured in the SBS second series of Go Back to Where You Came From. Abdi brought a global and new perspective to our school. He engaged our students and pointed out how success is possible through taking life's opportunities when they arise, especially in regard to education. Please ask your children to discuss what they learned from him with you.

Education State -

On Thursday, I travelled to Ouyen for a consultation forum about the new Education State initiative. It appears that our school should benefit from extra funding for our students through the changes to the funding models that are proposed. I have posted the consultation paper on the school's website for your perusal. As part of the Victorian Government commitment to make Victoria the Education State, the Department of Education and Training has begun a review into how schools can better support students with special needs including those with autism and dyslexia. The review into the Program for Students with disabilities includes the opportunity for parents to tell the Department what they think of the

current program and how it can be improved. You can get involved by taking an online survey which will be available from September via:
