# Alpine School and the Victorian Young Leaders Program to China -

The countdown is on for our two participating students in the School for Student Leadership program, Taylah Beer and Maddison Mudie. When they were accepted last year, for a stint in Term four this year they were told that they would be attending the Dinner Plain campus and carrying out a variety of leadership, personal development and outdoor education programs. However, in March they were given some very exciting news, that the School for Student Leadership was taking part in another program – The Victorian Young Leaders Program to China. The girls will now be heading to the Snowy campus at Marlo, on the 11<sup>th</sup> of October, where they will spend two weeks preparing for their six weeks in China. They fly out on the 24<sup>th</sup> of October with 42 other students.

arriving via Hong Kong, at the Utahloy International School, Zengcheng. During their six weeks in China they will participate in a rich learning program that will help them develop and demonstrate leadership skills, and to empower them to make an active contribution to their schools and communities as young leaders. Their program includes the regular outdoor activities, such as kayaking, rock climbing, abseiling, camping, cycling, caving and rafting. It also includes service projects like teaching English, painting and playing games with students at a local primary school, and cultural experiences - Chinese cooking classes, learning Kung Fu, visiting a factory and experiencing an Opium War fort and Museum, Pagodas and Temples, and a Lion Dance performance. They will also complete a Global Education Project over the course of the nine weeks.

At the core, the Victorian Young Leaders to China Program is about students' developing capabilities for modern ways of living, thinking and working.

Our girls are very fortunate to have the

opportunity to be part of a lifechanging international education experience. The girls will spend one re-integration week back at the Snowy-river campus, where they will complete their projects and presentations and reflect on their experiences.

They will return home to Murrayville in time to begin the last week of Term 4.


