#### Dentist visit -

This week the Royal Flying Doctor Service dental unit visited the school to conduct free examinations for students. A number of families took advantage of this service. The dentists also visited each of the primary classes to explain the golden rules of taking care of your teeth and ensuring a beautiful smile into the future. The dentists will be returning in November with their dental van to carry out any required work on the children's teeth. This is the first time in over fifteen years that our college has been serviced by a school dental service, however if this proves to be successful it will continue on an annual basis.

# University of New South Wales Mathematics




