any items that belong to the school and make sure that they are brought to school and handed in to Mrs Oakley. Thank you.


International Science Fair -

> their group. Tuesday there was a city challenge followed by


the poster presentations at the Australian Synchrotron. Our students presented a poster on water quality and taste.
