NAPLAN & Practice GAT -

I would like to congratulate all of the students who completed NAPLAN, practice NAPLAN and the Practice GAT (General Achievement Test) over the course of this week. Mrs Inglis has already marked a number of the Practice GAT responses. She was very impressed with responses to the two written communication prompts and stated that the focus we have had on writing, as a school, is clearly evident in the improvement in this area over the last few years. This preparation for Year 12 exams is proving invaluable and is one of the factors having a positive impact on our results.

It was fantastic that they were able to share some their learning and experiences with the rest of the college. Attitudes to School Survey -

This survey is undertaken by the department every year and its results are reflected in our school performance data each year. This year the department are moving away from the paper based survey and it will be administered online to students in Years 4-12 between the 22nd of May and the 9th of June. This survey is in addition to the work we are doing as a school to give our students a greater voice. I survey the secondary students from time to time about their perceptions of their classes and how they feel about their learning. Teachers regularly seek formal and informal feedback from the students about their teaching and make adjustments to their instruction and programs accordingly. As a Principal I welcome feedback from students or parents about our teaching and learning program at any time, and I prefer to have a conversation, than just receive data from a rigid survey.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card successfully validating with Centrelink on either the first day of term one or term two.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students and \$225 for secondary school students. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, and have not already made a claim, please contact Joylene Moyle at the school to make a claim.

BPoint Facility

\$40.85.

Parents, staff and community members are now able to pay school expenses in person or over the 'phone using a debit or credit card via the school's Bpoint facility. This service is provided in addition to the existing Bpay facility.

Bpoint transactions require the payee to provide their debit or credit card details (card number, expiry, name on card and ccv) along with an email address to which a receipt is generated from the Commonwealth Bank. This service has been engaged as it is sometimes difficult to source cash to pay for purchases at the front office, and also to enable purchases over the 'phone for items such as school uniform. Payees do need to be aware, however, that Bpoint attracts a 1.4% surcharge on top of the cost of good/services provided, and also a 29¢ Transaction fee. These additional charges are payable by the payee unlike Bpay which is free e.g. Parent A purchases uniform to the value of \$40 at the front office using Credit/Debit card. The total cost to Parent A will be \$40 + 1.4% Surcharge of \$0.56 + Transaction Fee \$0.29 =


