From the Principal

Digital Upgrade –

Although we haven't been officially informed by the department, it was announced by the *Sunraysia Daily* this week that our college will be one of the beneficiaries of a "\$16.4 million state wide investment to improve bandwidth and connectivity". This will be great as both staff and students have noticed a significant slowing of internet connectivity since the beginning of 2017.



University Students –

This year we have two students undertaking one university unit through Latrobe University as part of their Year 12 program. Lexi and Abigail are studying *Myth, Legend and History* this semester and *Ideas That Shook the World* next semester. The girls access their weekly tutorial through the Polycom videoconferencing facility on Tuesday afternoons. Successful completion of this program will give their ATAR a boost at the end of the year and to date their teacher reports that they are performing with the top cohort of the 477 Latrobe students studying the same course at the various Latrobe campuses across the state. They will sit their first university level exam on Tuesday the 20th of June. Keep up the great work, girls.

SAPOL Yr 11 Driver Safety –

On Wednesday afternoon our Year 11 students travelled to Pinnaroo to attend an educational session run by a serving police officer. He relayed to the students some of the personal stories related to road accidents and trauma for young people. He discussed the fatal five mistakes made by young people that increase the risk of being killed or severely injured in a road accident; these being:

- Speed
- Not wearing a seatbelt
- Being under the influence of Alcohol or drugs
- Driver distraction
- Fatigue.

He also gave the students strategies to get out of a car, if they feel it is being driven in an unsafe way. I attended with the students and felt that the 90 minute session was very well delivered and well received by the students. There were some very sobering messages delivered to these young people as they commence their driving careers.

College Council –

Council met on Monday night. A number of policies were reviewed and the new Parent Payment Policy was ratified. It was moved that a number of old trophies and plaques from the Murrayville Consolidated School and the small schools that have been held by the college, be donated to the Museum. The SRC requested approval to purchase a new toastie maker and smart TV for the student centre.
