From the Principal

Parent Opinion Survey -

We want to find out what our parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents at each school. It is designed to assist our school in gaining an understanding of parents' perception of school climate, student engagement and relationships with our parent community. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. The survey will be conducted online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd and takes less than 15 minutes to complete. If selected, your family will receive an email on Monday with a link to the survey. The survey can be accessed via desktop computer, laptop, tablet or mobile at any convenient time within the fieldwork period from Monday 7th August to Sunday 27th August. The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September.

NAPLAN results -

You may have seen in the news this week that the preliminary results for NAPLAN have been released. Victoria was again the highest performing state in Australia and it is pleasing to see that the initiatives introduced through "The Education State" are having an impact on students' learning state wide. Although I am very much looking forward to seeing how our students performed, their individual results have not yet arrived in the school and we are not yet able to login and access our school's results. As soon as these reports become available we will send them home with students. I will notify parents in the newsletter when this occurs.

High Impact Teaching Strategies -

As part of the Education State initiatives to improve consistency across classrooms, all teachers have received a booklet this week outlining the High Impact Teaching Strategies, promoting Excellence in Teaching and Learning. It was so pleasing to read, as all of the strategies outlined have been part of our teachers' professional learning focus over the last three years.


