### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF)

Parents or legal guardians who have a Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans Affairs Gold Card on the first day of term one (29 January 2018) or the first day of term two (18 April 2018), may be eligible to claim funds to be used towards Camps, Sports and Excursions (\$125 per eligible primary student / \$225 per eligible secondary student). Eligibility will be determined when a parent's concession card successfully validates with Centrelink on either the first day of term one or term two. If you think you may be eligible to claim CSEF, please contact Joylene Moyle who will assist you to make a claim.

The Primary UDSSA event is being run you luck as you compete against other students in our district.


