Education Support : Library / Canteen

A part time position at ESS-1 level exists in the Library and Canteen for all of Term 2 (16/4/18 – 29/6/2018), with the possibility of further employment.

The position is for 3 days per week (Monday/Wednesday/Thursday);
6 hours daily from 8.45a.m. to 3.15p.m. with half an hour unpaid lunch break.
Tasks will primarily involve overseeing the resources in the Library, including the cataloguing and ordering system, and ensuring adherence to DET guidelines regarding the school's Library Book and AV assets.

The successful applicant will require the aptitude to liaise with staff about faculty purchases, oversee the Library budget and assist classroom teachers when classes are scheduled in the Library.

The role also includes overseeing the general operation of the school Canteen and ensuring the Canteen meets all safe food requirements.

Responsibilities include food preparation, working in the canteen at school lunch times, accounting for daily takings, ordering stock, completing stocktakes and other daily operational tasks.

The successful applicant will be required to be trained in Safe Food Handling practices which the school will arrange.

This position requires flexibility to undertake all roles in the ESS-1 Dimensions of Work which will require some administration and office duties.



Freight trains have returned to the Mildura rail freight line and will connect with the reopened Maryborough to Ararat line following major track upgrades through the Murray Basin Rail Project.

You may still notice work crews and heavy machinery completing final track works and crossing upgrades.
