Last Sunday, the Year 12 Biology students got up early to attend a Biology outreach program being held at Mildura Senior Secondary College. This outreach program is run by GTAC and gives the students an opportunity to gain 'hands-on' experience in molecular biology techniques using equipment unavailable at most schools. GTAC is short for Gene Technology Access Centre, and they provide a wide range of resources, both online and face-to-face, to help students apply biological concepts to research applications. The outreach program is designed to give the students in rural and remote Victoria access to programs that would otherwise require a trip to Melbourne.

Our students are in a partnership with Manangatang P-12 College for Biology. This partnership

means the Biology students from both schools complete the same SAC tasks and are assessed as though they are a larger class. The partnership was formed during our school cluster days and by the support given by both principals. During the GTAC outreach

program our students worked in a small group with the Manangatang students on the research tasks. It was a wonderful opportunity for the students to get to know each other. Attendance at this event gave our students both new skills and new friends. *Karen Bailey*



Big Write/VCOP

The 5/6 class created a 'Wow Word Walk Way' in the classroom to help them expand their vocabulary in their speech and their narrative writing; which they are currently working on. 
