From the Principal

NAPLAN -

These confidential Literacy and Numeracy results finally arrived in the school yesterday morning and copies were sent home, addressed to parents, with the relevant students. Original reports are coming home with secondary students today and primary students on Monday. If you have a child in Year 3, 5, 7 or 9, please make sure that these have been handed on to you. Our school's NAPLAN results have been pleasing overall this year. Although our cohorts are small, there were some definite highlights. I was thrilled to see the growth in our students from 3-5 in spelling, showing the success of the Soundwaves spelling program. I was also still very pleased after much publication around the drop in writing results for Year 9 across Australia, that our writing results remained relatively strong, both in Year 9 and across the school, showing that our relentless focus on writing is having a positive impact.

From the Department on NAPLAN -

Victorian students achieved the state's best NAPLAN results ever in both reading and numeracy in primary and secondary schools. The figures show that Victorian primary students continue to be among the best in the country – and are getting better. If we exclude the ACT, Victoria was the lead jurisdiction on eight out of the 10 NAPLAN measures for primary students. The results show Victoria's Year 7 students are the first or second-best performing in four out of five testing areas: reading, numeracy, writing and spelling. Compared with last year, Year 9 students saw their mean score increase in four out of five of the testing areas: reading, numeracy, spelling, and grammar

and punctuation.

This shows that the investment of \$10.4 billion through the Education State reforms into Victorian schools and the hard work and dedication of the staff in schools is paying off, as positive outcomes for our students.

Interschool Athletics -

Congratulations to all of our students who competed in Ouyen this week - Secondary students on Wednesday and Primary Students today. Special congratulations to Joshua Matiwane and Malcolm Moore who both were awarded 'Age group Champions' on the day. There were numerous fantastic individual & relay results. It is wonderful that so many of our secondary students are selected to represent the college at this level and that almost all of our primary students chose to challenge themselves, stepping out of their comfort zone and giving every event their very best effort. Thank you to Mr Willersdorf and Mrs Wyatt for their part in organising our college teams and to all of the staff and parent helpers who assisted on either day or attended and cheered on our students.

Senior Pathways -

It was great to see so many students and parents here on Wednesday evening for discussion with VCE teachers about their possible subject choices in Year 11 and 12 next year. We are currently investigating some creative ways to provide greater choice for students in years 7-10 for 2019 and when this is finalised we will be running another information session around middle years electives. I anticipate that this will be in November.


