#### HPV @ The Bend -

Congratulations to Mr Milde and his charges who competed in our first HPV Super Series race since Loxton in 2019. For many of our students this was their first race and for all of us it was our first race at "The Bend Racetrack". The meticulous preparations and regular training during elective time at school paid off. It was a



fabulous day, the students, under the watchful eye of Mr Milde, managed the pit stops and rider changeovers very independently. Our students really enjoyed riding on the smooth surface of the purpose-built racetrack and the space provided by the spread of cars over its 3.5km length. Both cars were involved in minor incidents that scraped the paintwork. The Junior team were setting a cracking pace early and Liam

posted the fastest lap for the whole junior category on lap 4. The junior team were as high as 2<sup>nd</sup> place and spent quite a bit of time in 3<sup>rd</sup> place, before some of the schools with larger teams and fresher legs pushed us back a bit in the rankings. It was still a fantastic effort for these students in their first race. The Middle school team suffered an early set back after a roll over, with a buckled rim and flat tyre. After an associated long pit stop they rejoined the race in 34<sup>th</sup> position and worked their way up through the field with some great rides to finish in 21<sup>st</sup>. I think all students are pumped for their next race in Adelaide in a month's time. Thank you to all of the parents, grandparents and siblings who came along to support our riders and special thanks to Synon Peers who drove the bus to and from Tailem Bend on Sunday.


