NAPLAN -

NAPLAN commenced today for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 with the writing test. All of the NAPLAN tests are conducted online this year with the exception of Year 3 writing. The schedule is as follows:

Wednesday 15th – Lesson 1 - Writing Thursday 16th – Lesson 1 - Reading

Friday 17th – Lesson 1 - Conventions of Language & Lesson 3 – Numeracy

Catch-up tests will be provided next week for any students that require them. NAPLAN is just a snapshot of the students' performance at a point in time and although students should try their best, they need not feel stressed or anxious about their performance. Teachers use a range of varied assessments across the year to measure performance levels and growth.

Senior Girls Careers Trip -

The girls from Years 10, 11 and 12 spent Thursday and Friday in Mildura exploring a range of careers. They visited the Sunraysia Institute of TAFE, Latrobe Uni, Mildura Private Hospital and a beauty salon. The students explored careers in medicine and nursing, allied health and community services such as social work at the hospital. A wide range of further education opportunities and pathways were presented at Latrobe and SuniTAFE including courses for beauty. The students also enjoyed some social and bonding time on Thursday evening.

Pixie must stay at school because everyone can pat her at break times. – Alex.


















