#### Careers trip –

A number of Year 10, 11 and 12 students travelled to Adelaide on Thursday and Friday to participate in our senior careers trip. The students did two separate tours of Uni SA on Thursday. Before lunch they toured the City East campus which houses all of the Nursing, Exercise and Health related courses. After lunch they toured the City West campus that houses the Law, Humanities, Business, Architecture, Creative Arts and Design degrees. The facilities and teaching labs were state of the art at both campuses and very related to the vocation that the students are following. For most students this was their first taste of University life and although it is not for everyone it gave them some great information to consider.

On Friday the students attended the Careers Expo at Wayville Showgrounds. There would have been over 100 exhibitors and many had hands on experiences. There was something for everyone there, from careers in Cyber Security, the Federal Police, to building submarines, to early childhood education, to engineering, panel beating, swim teaching and everything in between. All Uni's and TAFE SA had exhibits, as did the residential colleges. All of our students came away with ideas and information from a range of career options. 
