From the Principal

This term is racing away and has been an incredibly busy and exciting one for students, staff and the Principal!

Budget Announcement – At the end of last week in the Victorian State Budget it was announced that Murrayville Community College will be receiving **\$4.68 million to upgrade and modernise the school.** This is an exciting announcement, especially as we are able to have a lot of input into the vision that we have for the

school moving forward and what we would like to see at our school. I would like to invite any interested school community members to a consultation session on Thursday the 15th of June to provide input into the initial processes for this. There will be further opportunities to be involved down the track, when plans and buildings will be discussed at more length. I will also be sending all families a few survey questions that will serve the dual purpose of providing input for the building project, but also for the 4 yearly review that is happening next term. Your perceptions, input and feedback is important and highly valued and I would really appreciate it if you can please either attend the session or provide some feedback through the survey.

Mission to Mars – I was lucky enough to accompany the majority of our secondary students on this fabulous camp last week. The activities that the students engaged in at KIOSC (Knox Innovation Opportunity & Sustainability Centre) were absolutely excellent, as were the teachers and facilitators. The students created illuminated etched acrylic signs in the first session, they then entered the world of virtual reality and had to complete various missions as though they were an astronaut training to complete various tasks on Mars. They then coded programs for a drone to make its way around an obstacle course (as though it was completing a mission on Mars). Finally on Friday the students had to code and program Lego Mindstorm robots to complete various missions on a Mars mat. All of the activities were challenging but very engaging for the students. The teachers and facilitators at KIOSC were blown away by our students and said that it was very rare to have such a wonderful group of engaged, persistent and determined students! I'm sure that the students received extra prizes and the school brought home a range of giveaways because of our students' demeanor. The KIOSC people said that we should be very proud of them and we most definitely are! A huge thanks to Mr Milde who coordinated the trip and to Mr Brown who also attended and supervised.

HPV – Congratulations to all students involved in the most recent HPV race at 'The Bend' on Saturday 20th of May. A huge thank you to the parents for their involvement throughout the preparation phase for assisting with supervision of training and for their help on the day. Luckily that was the only rain we experienced for the rest of the day. Both teams competed well in the S2 class which had 38 entries with riders from Year 9, or under 16s. Considering our riders

Narrative Therapy

As part of Reconciliation Week activities Ms Lozz led a Narrative Therapy activity with the year 4 – 6 class. The task to draw or decorate a tree with each part representing something different. The roots being where your family comes from, the ground being the present day to day activities they engage in, the trunk highlighting the skills and abilities they have and branches to identify hopes and dreams. The leaves were important people in their life, fruit being gifts from others and the clouds representing challenges and how they have overcome them. The students listened, engaged well and showed curiosity and wisdom, whilst respecting one another.



Reconciliation Week is 27 May to 3 June each year. This is a time for all Australians to learn about shared cultures, histories, and achievements with the intention of understanding how to reconcile. This kicked off with a bang at our school. The teachers, along with Ms Lozz, collaborated to research the heritage and culture of the Primary School students with the intention of coming together in placing their hands and background on a banner for all to see. At Recess Hangout the young people were able to decorate leaves with Indigenous colours, creating their own designs.

At Lunchtime Hangout the Secondary School was able to join in the festivities and place their hand in paint to show their respect for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to close the gap and join in Unity. It helped to start the conversation about what Reconciliation Week is about and why it is so important. The young people's enthusiasm was fantastic!
