School Broadband Initiative -



The Department of Education is offering free broadband for one year to eligible families. This is aimed at reducing the digital divide. To be eligible families must meet the following criteria:


- have a child enrolled in a Victorian secondary school (aged 12 to 18)
















Our Preps have been 'Determined Dragons'. They've been working diligently on their handwriting skills, number facts and ICT skills in class.
